- 2 This number reflects the number of AIDS cases reported this month to the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services. As of February 1996, AIDS cases in North Carolina are attributed to year of report. The **cumulative** number for AIDS cases is **1,476** in Mecklenburg County and **11,408** in North Carolina as of March 31, 2002. The **cumulative** number of AIDS cases reported to the CDC is **793,026** as of December 31, 2000. AIDS case reporting began in 1984.
- 3 The **cumulative** number for HIV Infection (not AIDS) is **3,761** in Mecklenburg County and **22,381** in North Carolina. This figure is based on reports of confidential testing done between February 1990 – March 31, 2002.
