Spring 2021 Youth Baseball – Player Equipment Checklist

The following items **MUST** be brought to the fields at Revolution Park for the scheduled practice sessions and scheduled games to assist with the current North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services recommended guidelines. There will be **no sharing** of any of this equipment at any time.

- Player's personal fielding glove
- Player's personal water bottle (clearly marked with player's name)
- Catcher's CUP (groin protection) for the 7-9 and 10-12 age divisions
- Team uniform including cap (Games Only)
- Face Coverings - people must wear face coverings while exercising if they are outdoors and within 6 feet of someone who does not reside in the exercising person's household, unless they have an exception, per current North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services guidelines.

MCPRD will be providing additional youth baseball equipment such as bats, batting helmets and catcher's equipment, as needed. This equipment, should any sharing be necessary, will be sanitized throughout the practices and games.

****Note - all catcher's equipment will not be allowed to be shared.**

Additionally, the following items are **strongly recommended** to be brought to the scheduled practice sessions and scheduled games to further assist with the current North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services recommended guidelines.

- Player's bats
- Player's batting gloves
- Player's batting helmets
- Catcher's equipment (mask, chest protector, shin guards) for the 7-9 and 10-12 age divisions
- Personal Hand sanitizer
